





LOCAL AID & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Equitable distribution of grant funds to meet the mobility, safety and connectivity needs of our communities

- 13 Grant Programs (Federal & State)
- Over \$500 M in State Aid Annually
- Over \$150 M in Federal Aid Annually

Program Criteria: County Aid



As of June 26, 2019 TTF Legislation amended:

- Department shall solicit by July 31st of each year.
- Each county shall submit an application for funding by December 1st of each year.
- ✓ 100% available at construction award.
- Projects over \$5,000,000
 shall use a New Jersey
 Department of Transportation
 prequalified contractor.
- ✓ 5% of its aid allotment can be for Design funding.

Program Criteria: Municipal Aid



As of June 26, 2019 TTF Legislation amended:

- Department shall solicit by April 30th of each year.
- Each municipality shall submit an application for funding by July 1st of each year.
- The department shall distribute an award letter to those municipalities receiving grant funds by November 30th of each year.
- Projects need to be awarded within 2 years of notification
- ✓ 6-month extension available if extraordinary circumstances are met.

MUNICIPAL AID PROGRAM



7 Categories

- Roadway Preservation
- Roadway Safety
- Bridge Preservation
- Pedestrian Safety
- Mobility
- Bikeway
- Quality of Life



Program Criteria: **Bikeway Program**





Eligibility

- Physically separated from motorized vehicular traffic through a barrier or an open space.
- Municipalities and counties are eligible.


Goal

 ✓ Constructing 1,000 new bike miles

* FY23 funded 17 projects totaling \$8.4M

Program Criteria: Transit Village Program





Eligibility

- Must have a Transit Village Designation
- ✓ The project is either wholly or partially within a ½ mile radius of an existing transit facility

Types of Improvement

- Promotes transit-oriented development
- Bicycle/pedestrian paths and lanes
- ✓ Construction of a modern roundabout

*FY23 funded 10 projects totaling \$2.9M

Program Criteria: Safe Streets to Transit Program



\$1* MILLION

Eligibility

- Project either wholly or partially within 1 mile radius of a Transit Station, a Bus Stop or a Ferry Terminal.
- Municipalities and Counties are eligible.

Types of Improvement:

- Improve Pedestrian access to transit facilities
- Construction of new sidewalks, curb ramps, sidewalk widening and major reconstruction
- Pedestrian signals and push buttons at key intersections
- ✓ Pedestrian oriented lighting
- *FY23 funded 29 projects totaling \$13.4

Program Criteria: Local Freight Impact Fund



Program implemented in FY 2018

- ✓ The NJDOT has allotted \$30.1 million per year in its Transportation Capital Program for this program for next 7 years (2018-2024).
- ✓ It is funded through the Transportation Trust Fund.
- Municipalities and Counties are eligible.

Program priority criteria:

- ✓ Pavement Preservation
- ✓ Truck Safety and Mobility
- ✓ Bridge Preservation
- ✓ New Construction
- ✓ Pedestrian Safety

Program Criteria: Local Bridge Fund



Program implemented in FY 2009

- ✓ The NJDOT has allotted \$47.3 million per year in its Transportation Capital Program for this program for next 7 years (2018-2024).
- ✓ It is funded through the Transportation Trust Fund.
- ✓ Formula driven for counties.
- Program priority criteria:
 - ✓ Structurally Deficient
 - ✓ Functionally Obsolete
 - ✓ Scour Critical
 - ✓ Minor Bridges
 - ✓ Priority Repairs



FEDERAL AID PROGRAMS

Safe Routes to School



- ✓ On-Street Bike Lanes or Shoulders
- ✓ Off-Road Bike Paths or Trails
- ✓ New or Upgraded Sidewalks
- ✓ ADA Curb Ramps
- ✓ Traffic Calming

Now funded at \$10 M a year

Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside



- ✓ New or reconstructed sidewalks
- ✓ Walkways or curb ramps
- ✓ Bike lane striping
- ✓ Wide paved shoulders
- \checkmark Bike parking and bus racks
- ✓ New or reconstructed off-road trails
- Bike and pedestrian bridges and underpasses

Now funded at \$25 M a year

Grant Applications

GRANTS CALENDAR Dates to keep in mind

May, June or July = Municipal Aid, Bikeways, Transit Village & Bikeways must be on your council's calendar for a Resolution

It's all in the Application

When Applying:


- Coordinate with LPAs, the Department, etc. when the project crosses other jurisdictions
- E-Resolution criteria

It's Important to:

- Allocate enough time to prepare and submit on time
- Take time to QA/QC the application

Common Errors:

- Project limits and the submitted map don't match
- Project estimate does not match the proposed project
- Requested amount not included
