General Meeting Notes:

The meeting began at 9:30 am with **Leigh Ann Von Hagen** welcoming everyone and summarizing the agenda and open space for general announcements and questions.

William Riviere from the New Jersey Department of Transportation's Bureau of Safety, Bicycle and Pedestrian Program gave some grants announcements:

- New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) Commissioner Diane Gutierrez-Scaccetti
 announced applications are now being accepted for the 2023 Transportation Alternatives
 (TA) Set-Aside Grant Program. The program offers funds for community-based "nontraditional" surface transportation-related projects designed to strengthen the cultural,
 aesthetic, and environmental aspects of the nation's surface transportation intermodal
 system.
 - Additional consideration will be given to applications that benefit vulnerable members of our communities, including low-income residents, minorities, those with limited English proficiency, persons with disabilities, children, and older adults.

- A new program requirement was announced. Pre-application meetings are now mandatory for all applicants. The Division of Local Aid offers pre-application meetings for this grant solicitation in conjunction with DVRPC, SJTPO, and the NJTPA.
 - The prospective applicant will receive guidance on whether the proposed project can be a good fit for the program.
 - o Pre-application meetings will be held from April 11 through September 30.

- Grant applications are due on November 3, 2022, at 11:59 pm.
- Safe Routes to School (SRTS) grant award letters have gone out to 31 municipalities across
 the state. The list will be posted on the NJDOT website under grant announcements and
 included in the next Safe Routes and Bike/Ped Resource Center newsletter.
- The Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grant program, which was created in the Infrastructure and Jobs Act (IIJA), funds regional, local, and tribal initiatives that improve roadway safety by significantly reducing or eliminating roadway fatalities and serious injuries. Applications are submitted directly to the US Department of Transportation.

- The Pedestrian Safety Program is developing marketing materials that enhance inclusiveness, consider different cultures, and engage all sorts of travelers.
- The Operation Lifesaver program allows NJT staff to go out and do specific programming on rail safety.
- For National Bike Safety Month, Opal and her colleagues did an employee engagement program with NJT staff.

- Discussed a pilot program for automated speed enforcement using Safe Streets and Roads for All funding and talk with partners to see if it is possible in NJ Vision Zero communities.
- Decided to table Title 39 revision discussions until after RSIS.

Thom Stead, Chair, Design and Infrastructure Subcommittee, outlined the discussion topics:

- Middlesex County shared its Strategic Action Plan for 2040 and brought up some conflicts between the RSIS and the Complete Streets guidance.

NJ Bike & Walk Coalition website related to the Safe Passing Law,

- Deb Kagan announced that on May 26, 2022, a resource center will be launched on the NJ Bike & Walk Coalition website related to the Safe Passing Law. It will have all kinds of resources for organizations all in one place, including access to social media toolkits, information about messaging, FAQs and information about the law.
- NJBWC will provide printed versions and materials for any organization or municipality interested.

- There will be a social media and video challenge to ask people to create their own posts about the law.
- A bumper sticker will be developed with graphics from the Safe Passing Law awareness campaign.
- A Google ad campaign will begin next week.
