What does a Complete Street do?

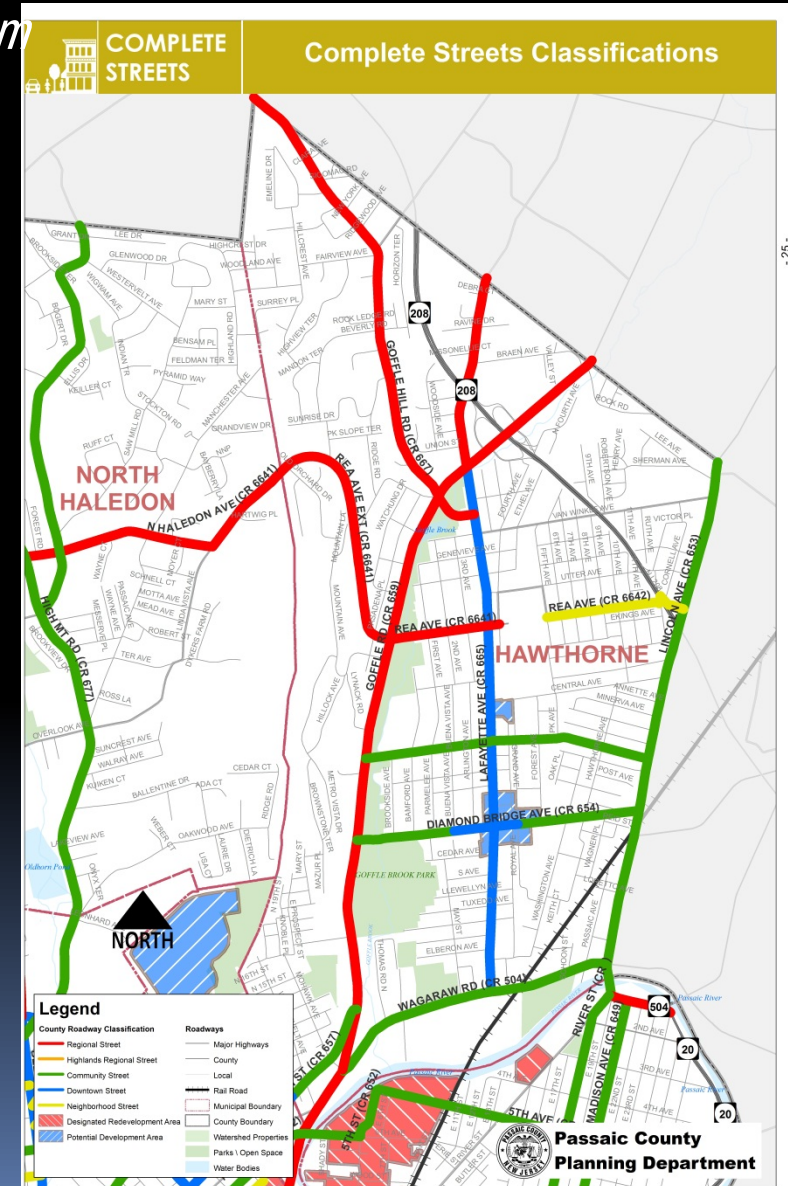

Complete Street Implementation Program

- Complete Streets Policy adopted February 11, 2014
- Includes checklists for development, preliminary engineering, repaving, and development review
- References the Passaic County Complete Streets Guidelines (CSG) and corridor classification system
- Being used for the **sixth** year of the resurfacing program
- Tracks outcomes in regards to types of facilities and impacts





Complete Streets Program Summary

2012 - 2017 Resurfacing Programs			
Category	Miles	Lane Miles	% Share
Total Program	~90	162.3	
Shared Roadway	19	36.6	21.5%
Bicycle Lanes	13	26	14%
Traffic Calming	34	68	38%
Road Diet	4.0	8.0	4.5%
Any CS Treatment	72	144	80%

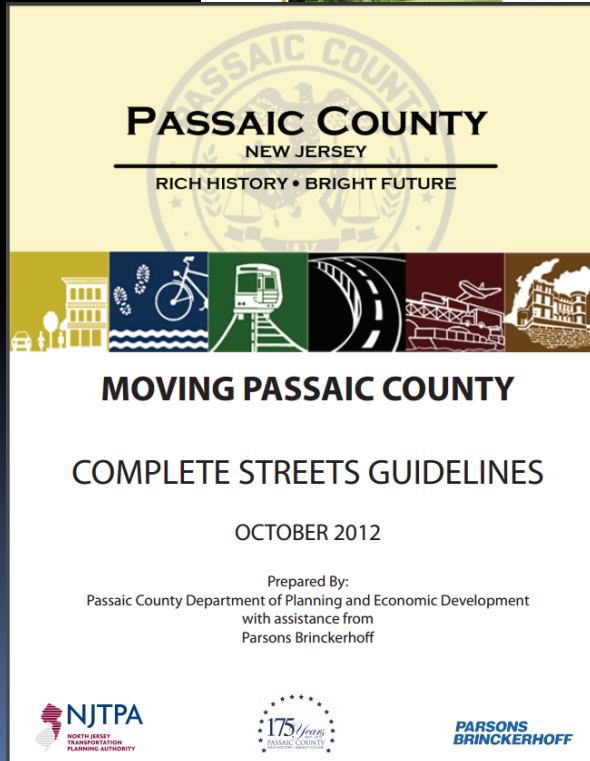
Resurfacing Program Improvements

WHAT'S A SHARROW?

Sharrows are used to guide bicyclists on streets that don't have bike lanes. They're a simple reminder to car drivers and bicyclists to share the road!

When you see sharrows on the road...

- 1 Expect to see plenty of bikes – and be ready to slow down and share the road.
- 2 Bicyclists will be riding in the middle of the right-hand lane to avoid the door zone.
- 3 Keep an eye out for kids on bikes – sharrows are often used around schools.

Hey, Bicyclists!
Sharrows are a reminder to avoid the door zone of parked cars. Please also follow the rules of the road: yield to pedestrians, obey traffic signs and signals, and never ride wrong way.
