What does a Complete Street do?

A Complete Street is judged by what it achieves, it addresses an **outcome based** on improving the livability and reflecting the needs, goals and character of the surrounding community and it provides great choice in mobility and land use decisions.



Complete Street Implementation Program

- Complete Streets Policy
 adopted February 11, 2014
- Includes checklists for development, preliminary engineering, repaving, and development review
- References the Passaic County
 Complete Streets Guidelines (CSG)
 and corridor classification system
- Being used for the sixth year of the resurfacing program
- Tracks outcomes in regards to types of facilities and impacts






Complete Streets Program Summary

Category	Miles	Lane Miles	% Share
Total Program	~90	162.3	
Shared Roadway	19	36.6	21.5%
Bicycle Lanes	13	26	14%
Traffic Calming	34	68	38%
Road Diet	4.0	8.0	4.5%
Any CS Treatment	72	144	80%




Resurfacing Program Improvements
