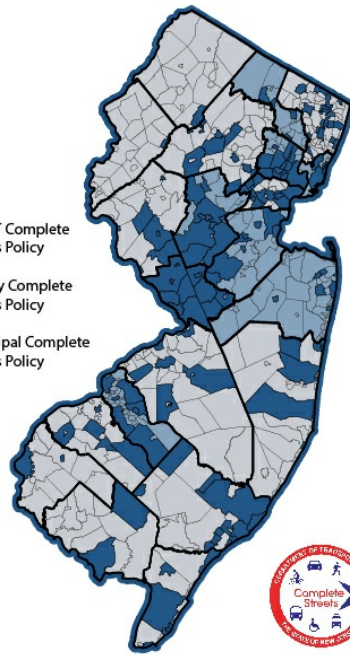
*An up-to-date list of Complete Streets policies in New Jersey*
