Diverse outreach efforts are very important to attract diverse groups as they increase creativity and innovation to solve diverse and unique problems. Parking taxes are coming to New Jersey. The Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey enacted AB 5070 that authorizes municipalities with a population of 100,000 or more to enforce parking taxes to finance projects to improve pedestrian access to mass transit.
