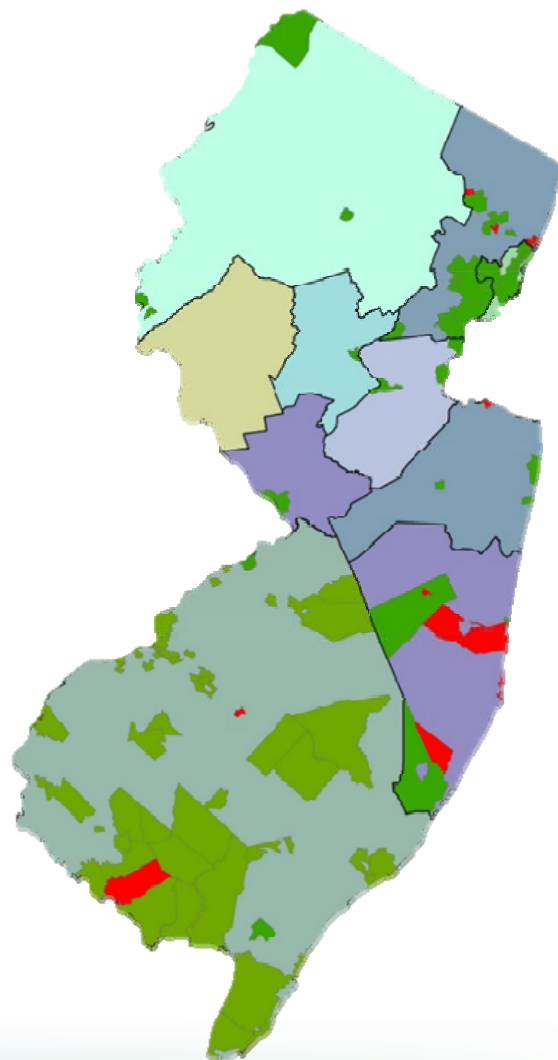

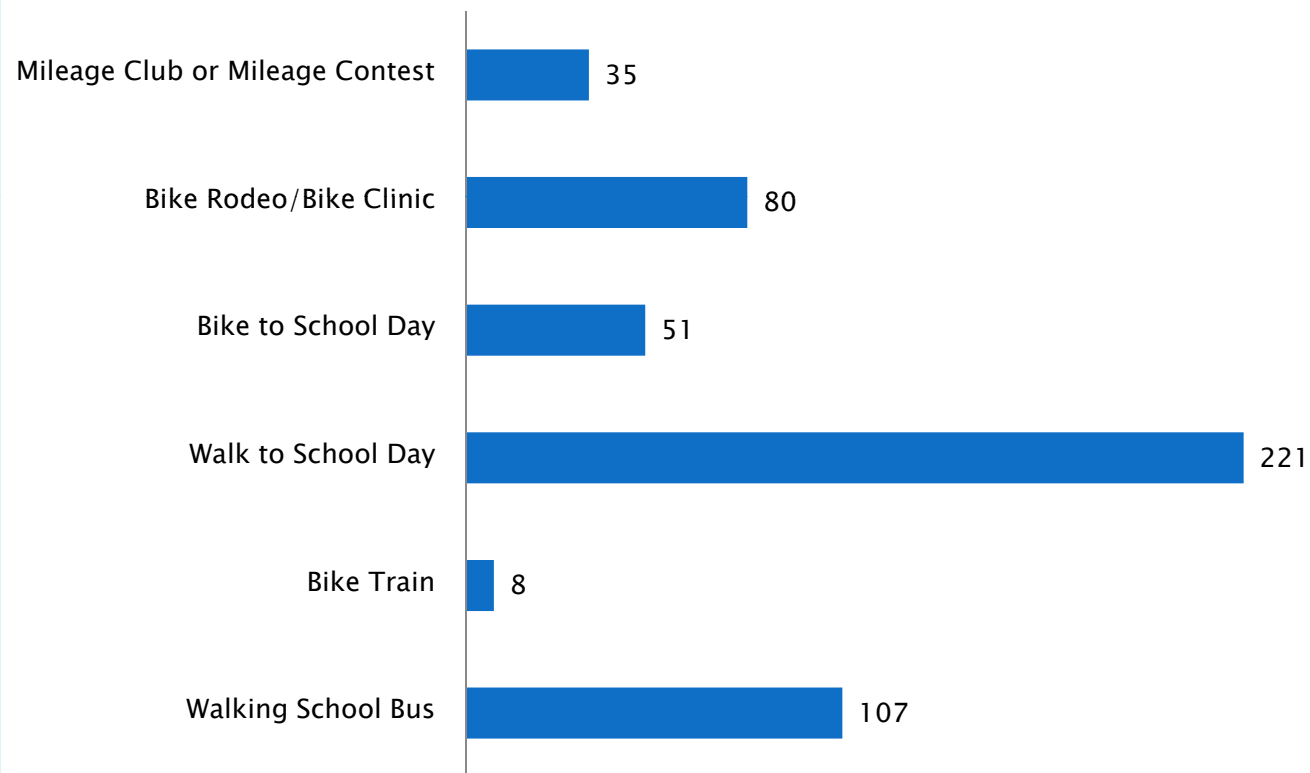

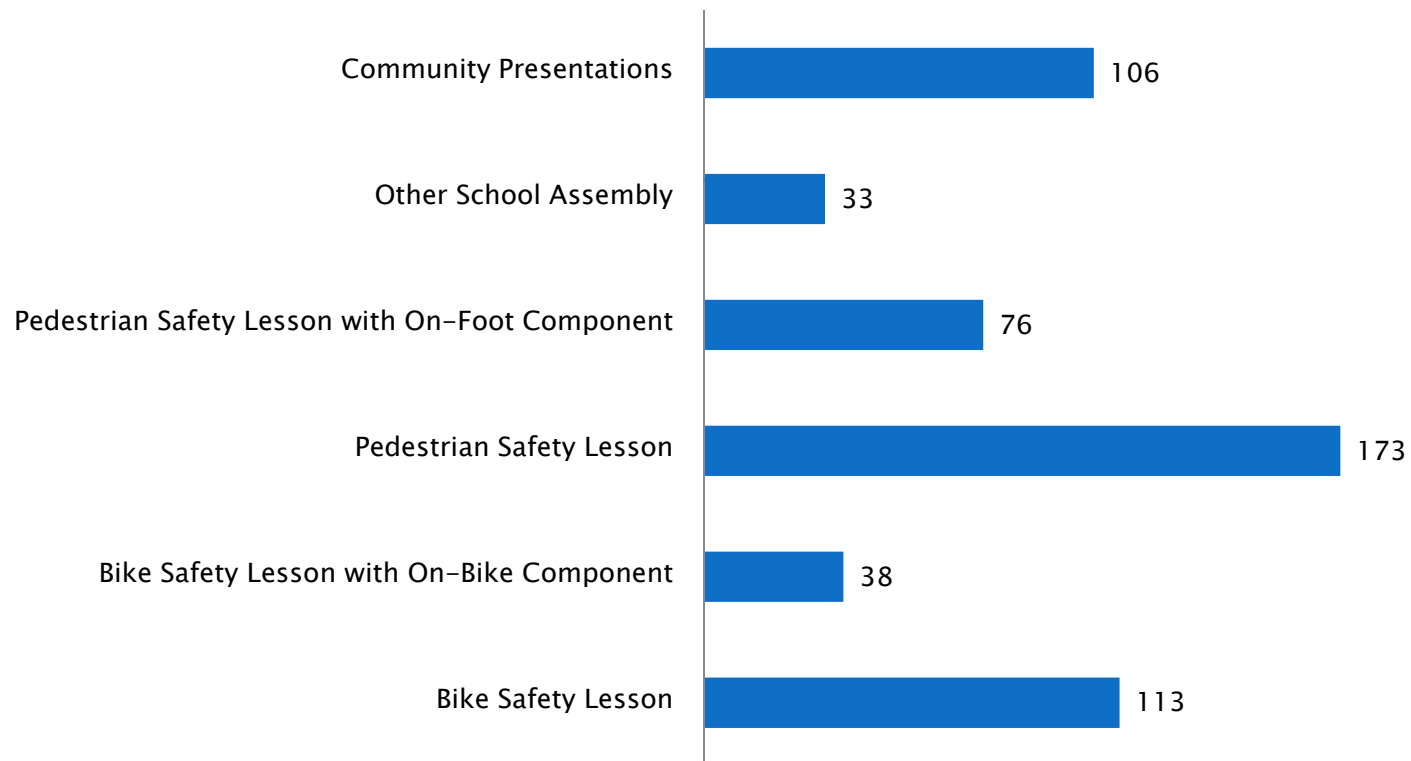
Pedestrian and Bicycle Events

TMA Statewide Pedestrian and Bicycle Events



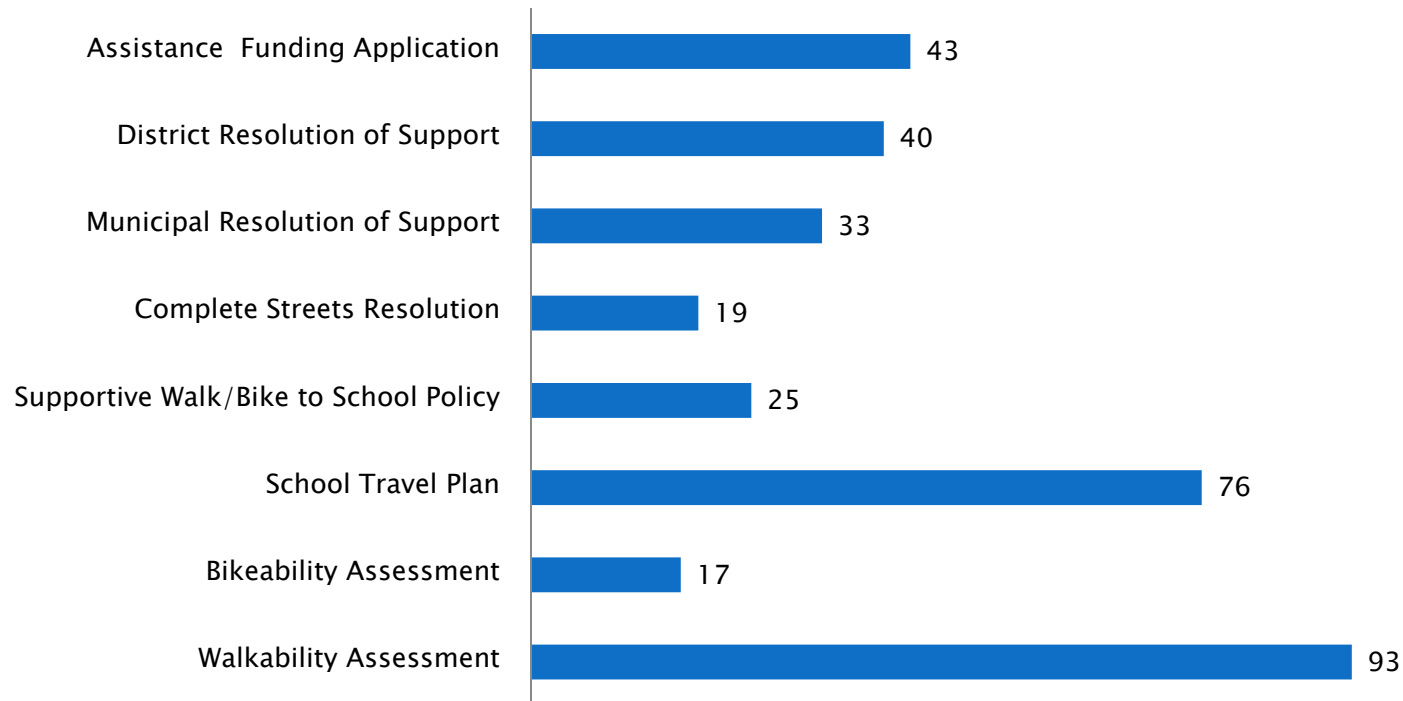
Educational Events

Planning and Policy Events

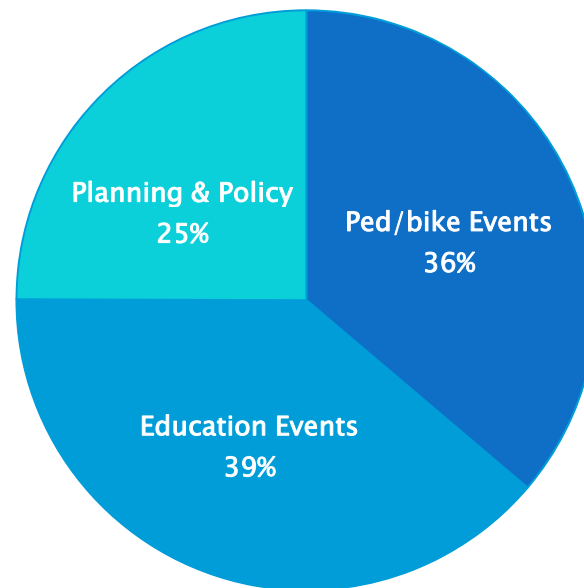
TMA Statewide Number of Planning and Policy Events

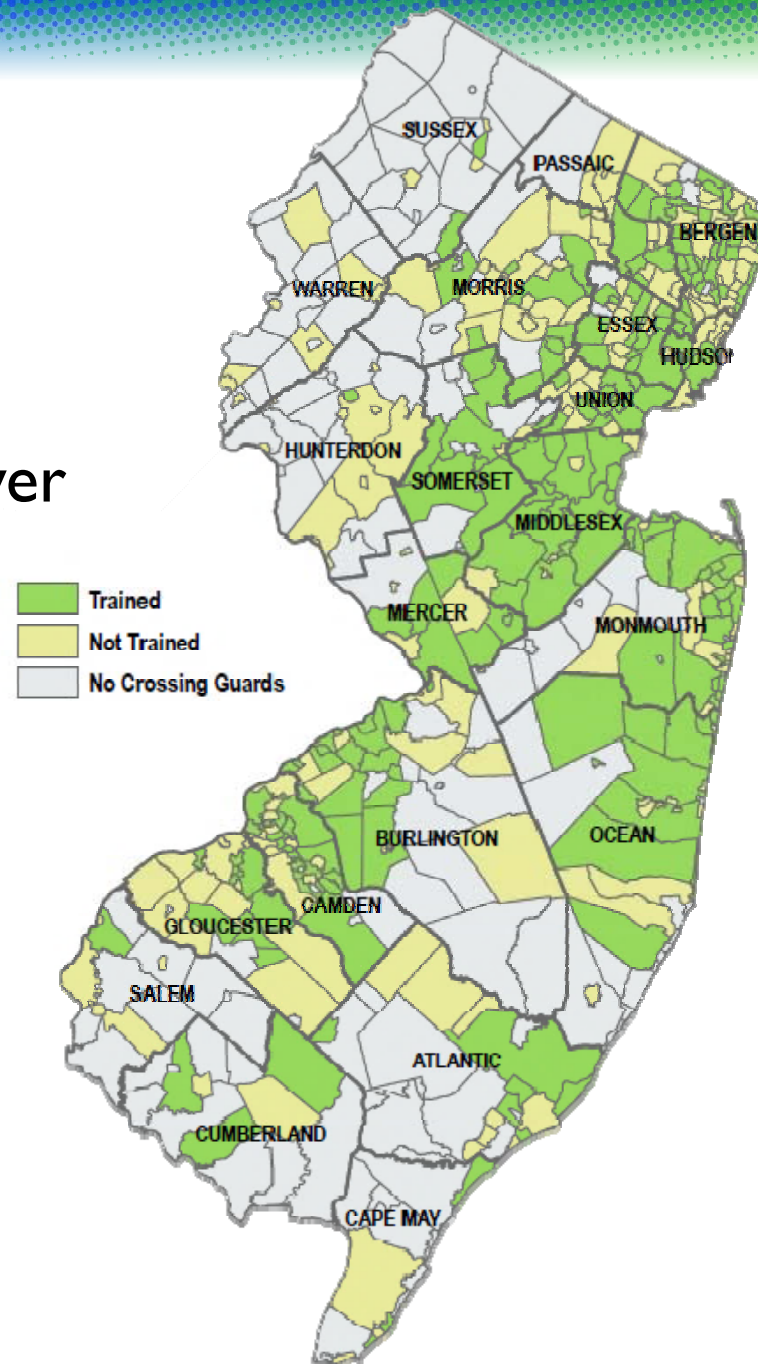
