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General Tips

Plan ahead

Read the route directions before beginning the ride.

Obey safety laws.

Obey all rules of the road! Keep right; ride with traffic, not against it. Obey all traffic signs and signals. In New Jersey, a bicyclist has the same rights and responsibilities as a motor vehicle driver.

Helmet Law

In New Jersey, anyone under 17 years of age that rides a bicycle or is a passenger on a bicycle, or is towed by a bicycle must wear a safety helmet.

Use signals.

Show your intention clearly when turning and changing lanes.





Share the road/trail.

Be aware of and respect the rights and safety of other road and trail users, especially children, pedestrians, and joggers.

Be aware of road conditions.

Users should take the route as they find it. NJDOT does not guarantee that it is completely free from conditions that may be a hazard to bicycle traffic. In preparing this route, every attempt has been made to select roads that can provide a quality bicycle touring experience. However, some route segments may have adverse conditions.

Road conditions continually change: pavements deteriorate, roads are resurfaced, more development leads to increased traffic. Conditions listed in this route were effective at this printing.

Be aware of traffic patterns.

Plan trips to avoid peak traffic hours. This route generally utilizes low traffic volume roads. However, be careful if you bicycle during peak commuter traffic.

0.0	0.0	Start from the traffic light at the exit of the parking lot of Double Trouble State Park
0.0	0.0	Left on CR 618 / Pinewald Keswick Road, Robert Miller Air Park is on the left
8.7	8.7	CR 618 / Pinewald Keswick Road turns into Lacey Road
9.7	1.0	Left on Cherry Street at Whiting Volunteer Fire Company #1, Many services are on the left
10.8	1.1	Left at stop sign on CR 539 / Warren Grove - Whiting Road
21.2	10.4	Stay straight at traffic light, on CR 539 / Warren Grove - Whiting Road cross SR 72
23.7	2.5	Sharp left on CR 610 East / Cedar Bridge Road (unmarked). Name changes to Warren Grove Road. For a side trip, you may decide to stay straight for 3.9 miles on CR 539 to see the Dwarf Pine Forest and the famous Warren Grove Range "Rock" at the intersection of Bombing Range Road and CR 539. The total roundtrip mileage for this side trip is 7.8 miles.
25.8	2.1	CR 610 / Warren Grove Road ends at the stop sign at SR 72, cross SR 72, continue straight on CR 532 / Warren Grove - Waretown Road
31.7	5.9	Stay on CR 532 / Warren Grove - Whiting Road, cross over Garden State Parkway. CR 532 / Warren Grove - Whiting Road changes to Wells Mills Road after Laurel Wyck Drive. Township of Ocean Recreation and Lake area is on the left
34.0	2.3	Stay straight at traffic light across SR 9, CR 532 / Wells Mills Road changes to Bryant Road after crossing SR 9
34.1	0.1	Stay straight on Bryant Road at stop sign / blinking light at Main Street to the Waretown Pier
34.7	0.6	Enjoy the water's view at the Waretown Pier, turn around and head back on Bryant Road
35.2	0.5	Right at stop sign / blinking light onto Main Street
36.2	1.0	Right at stop sign onto SR 9, Diner is on the right
38.9	2.7	Left at traffic light on Lacey Road. Caution: Busy Road, no shoulder for 2 miles, bike shop on left
41.2	2.3	Stay on Lacey Road, cross over the Garden State Parkway, use caution past right turn lane
47.2	6.0	Right on CR 618 / Dover Road (unmarked), Follow Hospital sign
51.0	3.8	Right at traffic light on CR 618 East / Pinewald Keswick Road
53.7	2.7	Right at traffic light to Double Trouble State Park parking lot
